

REVOLUTIONT

- Iow level-pirate activity
- simple "hit-and-run" robberies
- mounted close to land by small craft
- perpetrators normally armed with knives
- target portable ship items that can be brought out of the ship









Incidents in the ports and anchorages area in the Philippines from January – December 2020



- 9 in Manila, 3 in Batangas, 1 in General Santos
- Manila ports and anchorages was designated as one of the Green Zone for crew change by the IMO due to Covid-19 pandemic.
- Out of 9 reported incidents in Manila, 3 incidents happened in South anchorage area within three consecutive days from 4 to 6 Sept 2020.
- Out of 3 incidents in Batangas, 2 were transpired in August

The herein references urge all member States, in cooperation with the International Maritime Organization (IMO), to actively combat armed robbery at sea by adopting measures, including those relating to capacity – building through training of sea farers, port staff, and enforcement personnel in the prevention, reporting and investigation of incidents involving armed robbery at sea. Moreover, it is also recommended for Members State to bring the aforementioned regulations to the attention of all ship owners, ship operators, shipping companies, shipmasters, officers and crew.

2. Hence, you are hereby advised to be vigilant and watchful especially during night time and provide double watch while at the Batangas Bay Anchorage or moored at terminals to avoid the abovementioned subject to happen. Furthermore, besides the VHF channel 16 being the maritime communication frequency, you may also reach this Coast Guard Station thru cellphone numbers +63 917-842-6649 (Globe) or +63 998 585 5846 (Smart) for fastest and other means of communication during such emergency situation.

- Apprehension and filing of case in court against fourteen perpetrators while in the act of pilfering sacks of corn kernels and processed chicken feeds from the barge towed by M/TUG MIKA <u>in Manila Bay</u> last 30 Oct 2020.
- Apprehensions of 10 motor bancas <u>in Batangas</u> for violation of various maritime laws & regulations;
- No incidents of armed robbery/ theft against ships were reported since the last reported incidents in Manila last September and in Batangas last August.








