

I. SITUATION UPDATE 2021

- ➤ The year 2021 recorded a total of eleven (11) piracy and armed robbery incidents in the Philippine waters. (Manila 9 actual, General Santos 1 actual, and Tawi-Tawi-1 attempted)
- ➤ Type of vessels attacked: container ships (8); bulk carrier (1); barge towed by a tugboat (1); and dredger (1).


MANILA ANCHORAGE:

- ➤ Of the 11 incidents, 9 were reported at Manila Anchorage, specifically at South Harbour.
- The arrival of large foreign vessels in the said place for the purpose of international crew change seemed to have attracted maritime muggers operating in the Manila Bay area.

SEA ROBBERY




GENERAL SANTOS

➤ 30 JAN 2021- two (2) sea robbers were spotted on the starboard lifeboat deck of KOTA NEBULA while it was at Makar Wharf Berth No. 5 to 7, General Santos City. Two units of fire nozzles and two units of fire hydrant caps were reported missing.



➤ 03 MAR 2021- While underway, a white/red single OBM speedboat with three unidentified persons headed towards AKIJ PEARL and attempted to throw a line at her port side beam.






MARITIME PIRACY

Sulu-Celebes Sea

- The vast waters of the Sulu Sea worked to the advantage of pirates which prey on vessels passing in Sulu and Tawi-Tawi.
- From 2015-2016, a spike in Kidnap for Ransom (KFR) incidents was observed in Sulu-Celebes Sea which almost made this area a "high risk maritime area".
- The government's relentless pursuit of Abu Sayaff and ISIS members in Southern Philippines lowered the number of KFR cases in the succeeding years.




