


<b>Incident Report :</b>	11/2008
<b>Date/Time of Incident :</b>	29 Jun 2008 at 0130 hrs
<b>Location of incident :</b>	02° 30.6' N, 104°14' E
<b>Area Description :</b>	10 nm south of Pulau Tioman
<b>Name/Type of Ship:</b>	Wecoy 6 / Tug Boat
<b>Details of Incident :</b>	
The Singapore-registered tug boat, the <i>Wecoy 6</i> towing barge, the <i>Cakrawala</i> was underway to Singapore from Can Tho, Vietnam on 29 June 2008.	
At 0130 hrs on 29 June 2008, the tug boat was at 02° 30.6' N, 104°14' E (approximately 10 nm south of Pulau Tioman) when six men armed with long knives and axe boarded the tug boat from a long white speedboat with twin outboard motors. Four other men stood by and waited in the speedboat.	
The robbers took away the crew's personal belongings including a laptop, mobile phones, cash (estimated about RP1,500) and a portable VHF radio. After stealing the items, they sped off in the direction towards Pulau Pemanggil. No crew was injured. Please refer to map below.	
The ship master reported the incident to the MRCC of the coastal state and the flag state. The Singapore Port Operations Control Centre (POCC) has initiated a NAVTEX broadcast warning ships in the vicinity to look out for fast moving craft approaching their ships and to increase anti-piracy watch.

<b>Comment by ISC :</b>	Ship masters are advised to exercise vigilance at all times and maintain constant watch.
<b>Observation by ISC :</b>	<p>This is the second incident in 2008 involving a tug boat towing a barge in the vicinity. The first incident occurred on 30 April 2008 involving tug boat, the <i>PU 2008</i> towing barge, the <i>PU 3306</i>. At 2330 hrs on 30 April 2008, the <i>PU 2008</i> was about 25 km south of Pulau Tioman when six masked men armed with long knives boarded the tug boat from a dark blue speed boat measuring about 4 m long. They entered the accommodation area of the crew and stole laptops, mobile phones and cash (total estimated USD 3600) before escaping. No crew was injured.</p> <p>The modus operandi of the robbers in both incidents was similar in that the robbers would come alongside the tug boat in a speedboat under the cover of darkness. They boarded the tug boats, stole the crew's personal belongings and fled in their speedboat. There was no injury to the crew.</p>
