

Compared to January – March 2016


> Increase in number of attempted incidents is an indication of successful efforts by crew in deterring boarding



CONCLUSION

- Bulk of the overall increase is due to increase in attempted incidents. Number of actual incidents had decreased by 12% compared to Jan – Mar 2016
- Increase in number of attempted incidents is an indication of successful efforts by crew to deter boarding by perpetrators
- Of concern was the abduction of crew in Sulu-Celebes Sea involving the discharge of firearms at ships and crew which resulted in injuries and even death of crew
- The ReCAAP ISC reiterates collective and shared responsibility among authorities and shipping industry
