



## SEVERITY OF INCIDENTS

- > 1 x CAT 1 incident (abduction of crew)
- > 1 x CAT 2 incident (lowest number among Jan-Jun of 2007-2020)
- > Increase in number of CAT 3 incidents
- > 74% are CAT 4 incidents

### SITUATION IN THE SINGAPORE STRAIT



**INCIDENTS** 

- 13 occurred in eastbound lane of Traffic Separation Scheme (TSS)
- 1 occurred in westbound lane of TSS
- 1 occurred just outside (south) of TSS
- 1 occurred in precautionary area

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Littoral States to increase patrols and enforcement.
- Strengthen coordination and promote information sharing among littoral States.
- Ships to exercise enhanced vigilance and report all incidents to nearest coastal State immediately

## **ABDUCTION OF CREW IN SULU-CELEBES SEAS** AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

- Abduction of crew from fishing trawler off Eastern Sabah, Malaysia on 17 Jan
- 5 crew held in captivity

Status of abducted crew (as of 30 Jun 20)

86 Abducted Crew Since Mar 2016 10 Killed/Died

71 Release/Resuced

**EFFORTS BY AUTHORITIES** 

Arrested 3 members of Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG) in Sabah by Malaysian authorities

#### The risk of abduction of crew is high

- Occurrence of abduction of crew on 17 Jan
- Information of planned kidnapping in Sabah and Semporna, Malaysia targeting foreigners and crew of ships passing by the Tawi-Tawi and Sabah waters.

#### **ReCAAP ISC Advisory to ships to** re-route where possible, otherwise:

- Exercise enhanced vigilance
- Adopt piracy countermeasures to mitigate risk
- Maintain comms with authorities
- Make timely report to national reporting centres (as shown on right)
