

#### **OF CONCERN**

- Risk of abduction of crew for ransom is high as demonstrated by the incident of abduction of 9 crew on 18 Jun 19
- Increase in number of incidents in Singapore Strait
   [5 incidents (2018) vs 8 incidents (2019)]



# INCIDENTS IN SINGAPORE STRAIT

Jan-Jun 2019:

## 8 INCIDENTS

- Occurred on board barges towed by tug boats
- Underway in westbound lane of Traffic Separation Scheme (TSS)
- 4 incidents reported loss of scrap metal, 2 loss of tools and 2 nothing was stolen

## ABDUCTION OF CREW FOR RANSOM IN SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

## **Situation Update**

- On 18 Jun 19, 9 crew from two fishing boats were abducted off Felda Lahad Datu, Sabah, Malaysia
- The 9 abducted crew were released on 21 Jun 19 and recovered by Philippine authorities in Sulu Province

## Status of Crew (as of 30 Jun 19)





### **Warning & Advisory**

- The risk of abduction of crew is high
- ReCAAP ISC maintains its Advisory to ships to re-route where possible, otherwise
  - Exercise enhanced vigilance
  - Adopt piracy countermeasures to mitigate risk
  - Maintain comms with authorities
  - Make timely report to national reporting centres
