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
## **ReCAAP ISC Weekly Report** 30 Jun-6 Jul 2020

### **Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia**

#### **OVERVIEW**

During 30 Jun-6 Jul 20, two incidents of armed robbery against ship in Asia were reported to the ReCAAP ISC. Both were CAT 4<sup>1</sup> incidents that occurred on board ships while they were underway in the eastbound lane of the Traffic Separation Scheme (TSS) in the Singapore Strait.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> CAT (Category) 4 incident is classified as "least significant" in nature. Under this category, the perpetrators were not armed, and the crew not harmed.


#### INCIDENTS OUTSIDE ASIA

During 30 Jun-6 Jul 20, two incidents outside Asia were reported to the ReCAAP ISC by ReCAAP Focal Point (Singapore). Both incidents occurred on 2 Jul 20. The first incident occurred on board a Floating Production Storage and Offloading (FPSO) vessel while anchored at Okwori field offshore, Nigeria and the second incident occurred on board a general cargo ship while drifting in the Gulf of Guinea. # SITUATION OF ABDUCTION OF CREW IN THE SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

<u>Issuance of Warning</u>. On 2 Jul, the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) informed the ReCAAP ISC that five members of the Abu Sayyaf Group/Kidnap-for-Ransom Group (ASG/KFRG) were sighted in Barangay Sipangkot, Sitangkai, Tawi-Tawi on board a **white with yellow and orange stripes speedboat** powered by 250HP Yamaha engine on 21 Jun. The PCG validated that as of 30 Jun, the plan by the ASG to carry out kidnapping in Sabah and Semporna, Malaysia targeting foreigners and the abduction of crew from ships passing by the Tawi-Tawi and Sabah waters still stands. <u>ReCAAP ISC Advisory</u>. As the risk of the abduction of crew in the Sulu-Celebes Seas and waters off Eastern Sabah is high as demonstrated by the abduction incident on 17 Jan 20 and information of planned kidnapping in Sabah and Semporna, Malaysia, the ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert dated 21 Nov 16 to all ships to reroute from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise extra vigilance while transiting the area, and report immediately to the Operation Centres of Philippines and Eastern Sabah Security Command (ESSCOM) of Malaysia. #### RECOMMENDATION

The ReCAAP ISC urges ship master and crew to report all incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships to the nearest coastal State and flag State, exercise vigilance and adopt relevant preventive measures taking reference from the *Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia.*
