ReCAAP ISC Weekly Report 14-20 September 2021

Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia

OVERVIEW

During 14-20 Sep 21, three incidents (one CAT 2¹ incident and two CAT 4² incidents) of armed robbery against ships in Asia were reported to the ReCAAP ISC. All three incidents occurred in the Straits of Malacca and Singapore (SOMS).


One incident occurred to a ship while underway in the Malacca Strait (MS) (Johor, VTS Sector 6) on 13 Sep. The perpetrators were sighted entering the engine room. The general alarm was raised and the perpetrators escaped empty-handed. The other two incidents occurred in the Singapore Strait (SS) within an interval of four hours, and in close proximity to each other off Tanjung Pergam, Bintan Island (Indonesia). In the incident on 17 Sep, the perpetrators were sighted in the boiler area adjacent to the steering gear room exit door. The perpetrators fled upon being sighted. In the incident on 18 Sep, the perpetrators were armed with gun and knives, and they were sighted in the vicinity of the engine room. There was no confrontation between the crew and the perpetrators. In all three incidents, the perpetrators escaped upon being sighted, the crew was not harmed and nothing was stolen.

With these three incidents, a total of 27 incidents were reported in the SOMS (with 26 incidents in the SS, and one incident in the MS) since January 2021.

The location of the three incidents are shown in the map next page, and detailed description tabulated in the attachment.

¹ CAT (Category) 2 incident is moderately significant. Under this category, the perpetrators are likely to be armed with knives/machetes and in some incidents armed with guns. The crew is threatened or held hostage temporarily and, in some cases, the crew suffered injury and physical violence.

² CAT (Category) 4 incident is classified as "least significant" in nature. Under this category, the perpetrators were not armed, and the crew not harmed.

SITUATION OF ABDUCTION OF CREW IN THE SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

There is no incident of abduction of crew reported since the last incident in January 2020 up to today, and no crew is currently being held in captivity by the Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG).

On 23 Apr 21, the Philippine Armed Forces had conducted the military operation against members of the ASG during which one of the ASG leaders responsible for the abduction of crew in the area of Sulu and Tawi-Tawi had managed to escape. The threat of the abduction of crew in the Sulu-Celebes Seas and waters off Eastern Sabah remains high, particularly in the areas of Sulu and nearby waters off Tawi-Tawi.

The ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert dated 21 Nov 16 to all ships to reroute from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise extra vigilance while transiting the area, and report all incidents immediately to the Operation Centres of the Philippines and Eastern Sabah Security Command (ESSCOM) of Malaysia. RECOMMENDATION

The ReCAAP ISC urges ship master and crew to report all incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships to the nearest coastal State and flag State, exercise vigilance and adopt relevant preventive measures taking reference from the *Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia.*
