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ReCAAP ISC Weekly Report 16-22 March 2021

Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia

OVERVIEW

During 16-22 Mar 21, the ReCAAP ISC did not receive report of incident of piracy or armed robbery against ship in Asia. However, the ReCAAP ISC would like to advise ships to continue to exercise enhanced vigilance; and littoral States to increase patrols and enforcement in areas of concern, including the Singapore Strait, the Sulu-Celebes Seas and at ports and anchorages.

INCIDENT OUTSIDE ASIA

During 16-22 Mar 21, one actual incident outside Asia was reported to the ReCAAP ISC by ReCAAP Contact Point (Hong Kong). The incident occurred on 16 Mar to a bulk carrier while anchored at Callao Anchorage Area "1", Peru. The detailed description of the incident is tabulated in the attachment.

SITUATION OF ABDUCTION OF CREW IN THE SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

Rescue of the four crew who were abducted on 17 January 2020. The Philippine Coast Guard (ReCAAP Focal Point) reported to the ReCAAP ISC the rescue of the four crew who were abducted from fishing trawler *SSK 00543* by the Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG) on 17 Jan 20 at approximately 4.24 nm off Pulau Tambisan, Lahad Datu, Sabah, Malaysia.

Three crew were rescued on 18 Mar 21 when their watercraft capsized in the vicinity waters off Pasigan Laut Island, South Ubian, Tawi-Tawi, the Philippines. The last crew was rescued by the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) on 21 Mar 21 in the vicinity of Kalupag Island, Brgy Kalupag, Languyan, Tawi-Tawi, Philippines. The ReCAAP ISC has issued two Incident Updates on 20 Mar 21 and 21 Mar 21 on the rescue of the four abducted crew. Both Incident Updates can be found at www.recaap.org. With the rescue of the four abducted crew, there is no crew currently held in captivity by the ASG.

ReCAAP ISC Advisory. There is no incident of abduction of crew reported in 2021 so far, and no crew is currently being held in captivity by the ASG. However, the risk of the abduction of crew in the Sulu-Celebes Seas and waters off Eastern Sabah remains high as demonstrated by the information of planned kidnapping in Sabah and Semporna, Malaysia (as reported in ReCAAP ISC's Warning issued on 2 Jul 20), and the operation on 3 Nov by the Philippine authorities in preventing a kidnap-for-ransom incident. The ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert dated 21 Nov 16 to all ships to reroute from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise enhanced vigilance while transiting the area, and report all incidents immediately to the Operation Centres of Philippines and Eastern Sabah Security Command (ESSCOM) of Malaysia. The ReCAAP ISC urges ship master and crew to report all incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships to the nearest coastal State and flag State, exercise vigilance and adopt relevant preventive measures taking reference from the *Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia.*
