# **ReCAAP ISC Weekly Report** 2-8 March 2021

## **Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia**

## OVERVIEW

During 2-8 Mar 21, an attempted incident of armed robbery against ships in Asia was reported to the ReCAAP ISC. The incident occurred on 3 Mar to a bulk carrier while underway at approximately 9.2 nautical mile southwest of Sicolan Island, Sibutu, Tawi-Tawi, Philippines. A speedboat with three unidentified persons was heading towards the ship but they didn't succeed in boarding the ship. The location of the incident is shown in the map; and detailed description of the incident tabulated in the attachment.

As the incident occurred in the area where the Sulu-based Abu Sayyaf Group/Kidnap-for-Ransom Group (ASG/KFRG) elements are based, the ReCAAP ISC is concerned with this incident and has issued a Warning (01-2021) on 5 Mar 21. The Warning urges ship master and crew to exercise extra vigilance when transiting the waters off Eastern Sabah, and in the Sulu-Celebes Seas, in particular waters off Sibutu Island.

# SITUATION OF ABDUCTION OF CREW IN THE SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

The risk of the abduction of crew in the Sulu-Celebes Seas and waters off Eastern Sabah is high as demonstrated by the abduction incident on 17 Jan 20, information of planned kidnapping in Sabah and Semporna, Malaysia (as reported in ReCAAP ISC's Warning issued on 2 Jul 20), and the operation on 3 Nov 20 by the Philippine authorities in preventing a kidnap-for-ransom incident. The ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert dated 21 Nov 16 to all ships to reroute from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise extra vigilance while transiting the area, and report all incidents immediately to the Operation Centres of the Philippines and Eastern Sabah Security Command (ESSCOM) of Malaysia. The ReCAAP ISC urges ship master and crew to report all incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships to the nearest coastal State and flag State, exercise vigilance and adopt relevant preventive measures taking reference from the *Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia.*
